Victim's Rights

When a student or employee reports to the institution that the student or employee has been a victim of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking, whether the offense occurred on or off campus, the institution will provide the student or employee a written explanation of the student's or employee's rights and options.

The victim's name/identity of a domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault or stalking crime will be kept confidential upon request of the victim. To protect the privacy of the individuals involved, CES College will not release names without the consent of those involved unless the release is essential to the health and safety of the victim, or the campus community, or in fulfillment of the legal obligations of CES College.

CES College will complete publicly available record keeping, including Clery Act reporting and disclosures, without the inclusion of personally identifying information about the victim. CES College will also maintain as confidential any accommodations or protective measures provided to the victim, to the extent that maintaining such confidentiality would not impair the ability of CES College to provide the accommodations or protective measures.

CES College always considers and is committed to maintaining the privacy of the parties involved. However, because there may be circumstances when the college determines it is necessary to investigate and take action even though the victim has requested confidentiality and/or that no action be taken against the offender, confidentiality cannot be assured.
